#### MAGT Club

The children were told they had to use the digits  $1\ 2\ 3\ 4$  and the basic operations  $+\ -\ x\ 4$  / to create the numbers from 1 all the way up to 20. This is harder than it sounds! The children were in teams of their year groups and they each worked on their own sheet to find solutions.

Once they had found a solution, they wrote their calculation on the main sheet at the front of the class. They competed against each other to fill in a solution before another team did. It was the Year 2 group that found the first solution!! The groups all found additional solutions that were higher than 20 and the Year 6 team challenged themselves to find a solution that would make zero.
